A note from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers

<u>Changes to School Development Days from 2025</u>: Next year, all NSW Department of Education students will be starting school on Thursday 6 February, following 4 school development days. These school development days provide our teachers time to be best prepared individually and collectively to plan and implement curriculum.

Our <u>Small Schools Sydney Excursion</u> was a great success, thanks to the thorough organisation of Mrs Katrina Meenahan (Principal of Raleigh PS) and our Year 4, 5 and 6 students' positive behaviour, which was frequently commented on by members of the public. Rom and I are extremely proud of our students, and it was an absolute pleasure to share this great experience with them. Besides the buzz of visiting so many famous tourist attractions, students also enjoyed and benefited from traveling by ferry across Sydney's magnificent harbour multiple times and using trains and the Light Rail service to get around the city. This included interpreting information and timetables. Students were required to walk up to IOkm/day, which despite being tiring, everyone managed very well. Sites visited included:

Day I: Arrive-unpack at YHA The Rocks, ferry to Manly for fish and chips dinner.

Day 2: Taronga Zoo, Darling Harbour and Strike Bowling/dinner.

Day 3: Guided tour of The Opera House, which included a sneak preview of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra rehearsing, Sydney Aquarium, Madame Tussaud's, Paddy's Markets and dinner in China Town. Rom taught our students to how get the best price at Paddy's Markets!

Day 4: A First Contacts excursion, from the outstanding staff at Observatory Hill Environment Education Centre – this included a visit to The Rocks Museum, before sitting in a park under the Harbour Bridge (Dawes Point), where we learnt about Indigenous perspectives of First Contact and took part in weaving and creating our own stories, using Indigenous symbols. We then made our way to Cockatoo Island, where we had a guided tour of this convict and naval base. Students loved camping and interacting with students from other RROC schools.

Day 5: Final morning on Cockatoo Island, before making our way home.

Many thanks to our P & C for their generous donation of \$150/student towards the cost of this trip and to the principals, staff and students of Raleigh, Repton and Orama Public Schools, whose company we had the pleasure of enjoying. Thanks also to Mrs Wain, for updating the school's Facebook page each evening, with photos and information for families. Please check this out if you haven't had a chance to already.

Tuesday's excursion for K-2 students to <u>Yarrila Place</u> and 3-6 students' <u>Ocean Safety Awareness Award (OSAA) Day</u> at Sawtell Beach was another great day. K-2 students were able to borrow books from this outstanding library, which they can return to any other local library, such as Toormina or Woolgoolga. This is a wonderful resource which families can utilise after school any day, in addition to weekends and school holidays. Please read more about our OSSA Day from our Year 3 students on page 5.
