A note from the Principal

I am extremely proud of our Year 3 and 5 students who have tried their best in NAPLAN tests, over the past week. These tests will be completed over the remainder of this week. Parents and schools will get results during Term 2.

Attendance: Students who attend school regularly make the best academic progress. As at the end of Week 7 (last Friday), our K-6 school attendance is 93.2%, which is very pleasing. If your child is sick, they need to be home. However, if they are feeling slightly unwell, please send them to school, as once children get busy with their friends and learning, they often forget about feeling unwell. The school will always call you if your child is unwell. Of course, as your child's parent, you are the best person to decide if your child is too unwell to attend school.

If your child is absent, please either notify us via the School Bytes app or call the school to inform us of the reason for the absence. Absences which are unaccounted for are recorded as Unauthorised Absences. Your assistance in contacting the school by IO.00am on the day of your child's absence is greatly appreciated.





In our recent Stage 3 Maths unit on measurement, students enjoyed creating their own Tiny Town, on A3 paper, using multi attribute unit blocks (MAB) to represent IOO metres and the MAB long blocks to represent one kilometre.
